Policy Statement

We believe that it is important to include and welcome all children and families, ensuring that they feel happy, safe and secure at all times.

Aim

- To ensure that each child is treated equally, but as an individual.
- To ensure that they feel safe, secure, settled and nurtured.
- To avoid any discrimination, promoting a positive, warm and friendly environment that all children and families feel equal.
- To ensure the child is reaching their full developmental potential.

Method

In order to achieve our aim, we would in the event of English being an additional language:

- Liaise with families, inviting them into the setting to gain as much information about their first language as possible.
- With the family develop a strategy to encourage the language within our setting.

- Learn key words, so as a group we may understand parts of the language, such as hello and goodbye.
- Liaise with other professionals, such as the language support team, health visitors and any other contacts.
- Include the language as often as possible within our curriculum, perhaps invite the family in to teach our children some of the key words.

Equal Opportunities

 Busy Bees aims to show respectful awareness of all major events in the lives of our children and families. We will therefore celebrate and acknowledge a variety of festivals.

Employment

 Busy Bees will always appoint the best person for each job, we will treat all applicants fairly and without prejudice.

Additional Needs

 Busy Bees recognises that all children have a wide range of needs, that differ from time to time and from one child to another. We will always consider what part we can play to meet the individual needs of all children and how to provide opportunities which will help each child to reach their full potential.
